As part of the senior leadership staff, directs and manages programming for the development of the spiritual and religious lives of children, youth, and adults at the UU Church in Eugene.

- Collaborate with ministers, lay leaders, and congregants to create a vision for the children & youth portion of faith formation.
- Ensure adequate resources for consistent weekly programs. Includes staffing, materials & supplies, and high quality lessons.
- Plans and organizes non-Sunday programs such as Coming of Age, OWL, Bridging, etc.
- Ensures that the program & staff budgets are managed according to fiscal policies.
- Responsible for updating and maintaining Safe Congregation policies as it relates to children & youth.
- Provide staff leadership to the children & youth advisory council as well as to the adult program volunteers.
- Serve as part of the worship team to ensure age-appropriate experiences for all ages and to help coordinate themes used across all programs.

- Maintain knowledge of current trends in religious education from a wide variety of sources.
- Maintain the current positive working relationship with the school that shares our classrooms.
- Hire, train, and supervise paid childcare staff.
- Meets weekly with the staff team and weekly with the minister.
- Completes annual program reports and submits annual budget requests.
